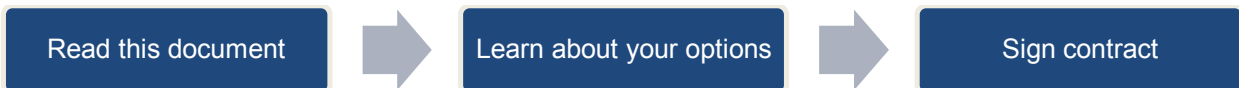




Important information for pool owners

This document must accompany any contract for the inspection and certification of a swimming pool for compliance with the *Swimming Pools Act 1992* under clause 19A (5) of the Building Professionals Regulation 2007.



If your pool is found to be non-compliant today, you have three options to rectify defects:

- **Your certifier can fix the pool fence**

The certifier can repair your pool fence and issue a certificate of compliance if your certifier has an authority under the Home Building Act that allows them to construct a swimming pool or construct structural landscaping.

It's a good idea to check whether your certifier holds the required licence or qualified supervisor's certificate at the NSW Fair Trading website at www.fairtrading.nsw.gov.au. The repairs must cost no more than \$1,000, including materials and labour, and the repairs must be completed as expeditiously as possible. **You don't have to accept the certifier's quote.**

- **You're free to get quotes from other tradespeople**

- **You can do the repairs yourself.**
